G20 Summit Day 2 live updates: Prep meetings in all five regions, says Brazil Prez

Chennai, Sep 10 2023: Following the successful day 1 of the 18th G20 Summit that witnessed the induction of African Union into the bloc; comprehensive rail and shipping connectivity between US, India, Saudi Arabia and Gulf states and European Union; Delhi Declaration was adopted by the nations in order to uphold territorial integrity, sovereignty with adherence to the international law, the declaration was agreed by China and Russia as well; Indian PM Modi announced Global Biofuel Alliance as a measure for the usage of cleaner fuels. The second and the final day of the



Summit will begin with a tree planting ceremony at the venue, subsequently the third session will commence at 10:30 AM. At 1 PM Russian Foreign Minister will hold a press conference and at 2 PM Turkey President Recep Tayyip Erdogan will meet the press. The closing press conference would be held by Indian Foreign Minister S Jaishankar and G20

Sherpa Amitabh Kant and Japanese PM Fumio Kishida would hold a presser at 3 PM. Earlier, the world leaders laid wreath at Rajghat at the tomb of Mahatma Gandhi, paying respect to the Indian independence movement leader. Also, UK PM Rishi Sunak visited the Akshardham Temple with his family on Sunday morning.

G20 Summit Day 2 live updates: Prep meetings in all five regions, says Brazil Prez

Chennai, Sep 10 2023: India has produced 66.14 MT crude steel in January-June 2023, registering a 5 per cent year-on-year growth and the uptrend is likely to continue in second half of the year as well, according to SteelMint. The domestic industry had produced 63 million tonnes (MT) crude steel in the January-June period of 2022, the research firm said. The increase in production was mainly on account of improved capacity utilisation rates coupled with the ramping up of capacities by key Indian steel players, it said. According to SteelMint these factors will continue to support the growth in production in the second half of the ongoing year, SteelMint added. The domestic steel consumption also registered an 11 per cent year-on-year (y-o-y) increase to 58.4 MT in the first half of 2023, from 52.7 MT in the same period of 2022. Steel exports took a hit of 30 per cent during the period under review, as China increased its outbound shipments of steel. "India's steel exports dropped to 4.74 MT in H1 from 6.70 MT recorded in the first half of 2022. The reason behind the drop in exports was majorly because of the cheaper availability from China and subdued demand in traditional import markets," SteelMint said. China's home demand had not been up to the mark. Therefore, it had no other way to liquidate the inventory rather than to divert it to exports at discounted rates, the research firm said. After China, India is the second largest steel producing country in the world.

Hindu-Americans urge California governor to veto anti-caste discrimination bill

Chennai, Sep 10 2023: Hundreds of Hindus in the US state of California gathered to protest against an anti-caste discrimination bill, which they say will further fuel instances of Hinduphobia if signed into law. The SB 403 bill, which seeks to outlaw caste-based discrimination in the state, was passed in the California Senate last week with an overwhelming 31-5 votes, and now rests with Governor Gavin Newsom for clearance. Holding banners and placards, Hindus in Californian city of Sacramento on Saturday urged Newsom to veto the bill, which if signed, will make California the first state in the US to add caste as a protected category in its anti-discrimination laws. "Governor Newsom you stood with us in 2017 when you supported our community to ensure that Hindus and Indians are not misrepresented in California's textbooks. We ask you to stand with us one more time by vetoing SB 403," said Samir Kalra from advocacy group Hindu American Foundation (HAF). "We ask you Gavin Newsom to Veto SB 403 so history remembers that you said no to discrimination against Indian Americans and said no to racially profiling our



community," the HAF, which is planning to file a lawsuit against the bill, wrote on X. Sharing videos and images from the peaceful protest, US-based Hindu advocacy group, Coalition of Hindus of North America (CoHNA), wrote on X: "Gavin Newsom, we hope you see how deeply concerned our community is about this bill and its potential impact on us". Asserting that the bill seeks to "silence" the Hindus, CoHNA said that SB 403 "is not facially neutral, allows for the targeting and profiling of Hindus and violates our civil rights". "Caste' is not neutral like race, religion, gender, ethnicity, ancestry and other categories. And, existing California laws can already address any claims of caste discrimination," CoHNA said, urging Newsom to "stand on the right side of history". The bill, introduced by Senator Aisha Wahab in March, adds caste as a protected category to an existing

Adani hikes stake in two group companies

Chennai, Sep 10 2023: Billionaire Gautam Adani-led promoter group has increased stake in two of the group's listed companies, as the ports-to-energy conglomerate continues to work on a claw back strategy after being hit by damaging reports. The promoter group has increased stake in Enterprise to 71.93 per cent from 69.87 per cent, according to stock exchange filings. This is the second time in less than a month that the promoters have raised stake in the flagship firm that incubates new businesses. The after being hit by last month increased stake in Adani Enterprises Ltd from 67.65 per cent to 69.87 per cent. The

promoter group has also increased stake in Adani Ports and Special Economic Zone Ltd from 63.06 per cent to 65.23 per cent, the filings showed. Resurgent Trade and Investment Ltd bought almost one per cent stake in Adani Ports and Special Economic Zone Ltd in open market transactions and another 1.2 per cent was purchased by Emerging Market Investment DMCC. Both are promoter group firms. In the case of Adani Enterprises Ltd, the shares were bought by Kempas Trade and Investment Ltd and Infinite Trade and Investment Ltd. The filings said the stakes were bought in open market transactions between August 14 and September 8. The stake increase comes within weeks of the US-based boutique investment firm GQG Partners buying shares in Adani group firms. GQG has increased its stake in Adani Ports & Special Economic Zone (APSEZ) to 5.03 per cent last month by way of a bulk deal, stock exchange filings showed. GQG now has a stake in five of the 10

off the allegations and has since May invested in Adani firms. GQG had previously picked up a 5.4 per cent stake in Adani Enterprises, a 6.54 per cent stake in Adani Green Energy Ltd and a 2.5 per cent stake in Adani Transmission Ltd. Adani stocks have since recovered some of the losses. GQG has so far invested Rs 38,700 crore in Adani Group firms. Qatar Investment Authority (QIA) has invested Rs 4,100 crore in Adani's Green Energy and Bain Capital has poured in Rs 1,440 crore, helping re-build investor confidence. In addition to stake sale by promoters, the three portfolio companies have received board approvals for primary issuances through a share sale to investors. Adani Enterprises plans to raise Rs 12,500 crore through share sale to investors while Adani Transmission plans to mop up Rs 8,500 crore. Adani Green Energy plans to raise Rs 12,300 crore. Adani Enterprises is incubating the green hydrogen projects while Adani Green Energy is the renewable energy arm that is building 45 GW of capacity by 2030.

Airbus signs MoU with Gati Shakti Vishwavidyalaya to develop aerospace human capital in India

Chennai, Sep 10 2023: Airbus, a pioneer of the global aerospace industry, and the Vadodara-based Gati Shakti Vishwavidyalaya (GSV), have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for a holistic partnership that includes development of academic curricula, faculty, industrial experience, training and scholarships, and collaboration with international institutes.

For Airbus, India is not just a market but a strategic resource hub where the company is expanding its industrial footprint, including aircraft assembly, manufacturing and design, as well as developing training and academic collaboration to mature all the building blocks required for an integrated aerospace ecosystem in the country.

The MoU was signed in the presence of Hon'ble Minister for Railways, Communications and Electronics & Information Technology, Government of India, Shri Ashwini Vaishnaw. As per the MoU, Airbus and the GSV, a central university under the administrative control of the Ministry of Railways, Government of India, will collaborate in the fields of research, teaching,



and training of students to deepen their understanding of the scientific, technological, and management topics pertaining to the aerospace sector. Both entities will work together to support the development of the academic curriculum as well as the executive programmes relevant to the sector. Additionally, they will explore potential synergies for joint research, partnerships with international institutes and internship and placement opportunities for the students of GSV.

Speaking at the signing, Rémi Maillard, President and Managing Director, Airbus India and South Asia, said, "We subscribe to the Gati Shakti vision of seamless and efficient connectivity. We are committed to developing India as a global aviation hub and to further supporting the growth of the commercial aviation

industry in the country. A core element of the aerospace ecosystem is talent development. Under this partnership with the GSV, we will bring in our global expertise to develop the best diverse talents in India and build a strong pipeline of skilled workforce for the sector."

GV Prakash has composed the music for me after eight years and has given the required strength to the film with his music even before the release. Also, I get an experience with every film. But after 20 years, an event that surprised me happened in this film. In a scene where actor Sunil and I were acting, I only have one word to deliver. But he has four pages of lines. Whilst he was acting with different facial expressions like anger, pleading, sad and aggression, I was amazed without realizing it. When the scene was over, I hugged him and congratulated him. His performance in this film will surely teach a lot to the actors who will come after him. I am saying it as an actor who came through the 'koothupattarai'. Apart from that, SJ Suryah also sets a good tempo

in every scene. I learned a lot of lessons from SJ Suryah for free when I was acting with him. I met SJ Surya for the first time as my college senior during the hostel selection. No matter how many problems he has faced over the years, he hasn't changed till date".

"We decided the release date of the film a month and a half before. If it is a sports competition, it is interesting only if there are many players. Whatever film enters the field, it has to face the competition. 'Jawan' is releasing only in Hindi, so we are releasing it in Hindi on September 22 after a week".

"I had an opportunity to act with Vijay in 'Leo'. But as I am acting only in one film at a time, I couldn't grab the opportunity for 'Leo'. Then I told Lokesh, "You are lucky... you have got a good opportunity again use it". I am also preparing to direct a film with Vijay next".

Actor SJ Suryah said, "The best part is, we shot a family film

together as bachelors. Then, we were shooting a fight sequence for the climax scene. The lorry driver who was speeding towards us stepped on the accelerator instead of the brake. I noticed that. Vishal didn't notice it. But as the crew screamed in shock after seeing this, he turned the vehicle towards the director's seat. Fortunately, everyone escaped by jumping to the other side. Also, everyone wants to act, but Vishal wants to leave acting and go for direction".

"I am not the old Adhik Ravichandran", began Director Adhik Ravichandran. "SJ Suryah has this line in this film... 'I have forgotten everything and changed my mind'; it applies to me. The story is about the hustle and bustle while running to achieve it, at its centre is a telephone".

"When Vishal got down from his caravan with make-up for his character, almost 500 people gathered and applauded and after this we were partially satisfied that the film was going to be a success".

"Vishal would often forget he was in character and would clap in most of the scenes of SJ Suryah. If asked why he did that, he would say, "It was great, take another take", said Adhik Ravichandran.

Chennai, Sep 10 2023: We have just received a good news. Due to the hard work of our teams and the support of all of you, the New Delhi G20 Leaders' Summit Declaration has been agreed on.

I propose that we also adopt this Leaders' declaration. I declare to adopt this declaration.

On this occasion, I would like to congratulate our Minister, Sherpa and all the officials who have put in immense effort to make this worthwhile, and therefore, they all deserve to be congratulated.

Your Highness, Excellencies, in our ancient Vedas, which were composed thousands of years ago, it is said - This means, "I am one; let me become many." We need to move from "I" to "We" for creation, innovation, and viable solutions.

"I" to "We", that means thinking of the whole from the self,

the well-being of "us" instead of just "me."

We have to emphasize on this. We must connect every class, every country, every society, and every region of the world.

And this is the essence of the One Family concept.

Just like every family has its own support system, we need to build a global support system together.

We should develop the mindset that someone else's happiness should make us happy, and someone else's sorrow should make us equally sad. When we think as One Family, we also keep in mind how to empower each member. It is in this spirit that India wants to share its every experience with its huge global family.

In India, we have adopted technology as a bridge to make development inclusive and sustainable.

India has developed a new model of inclusion,

transparency, and targeted interventions with the JAM Trinity of bank accounts, Aadhar identity and mobile phones. The World Bank has also acknowledged that the JAM Trinity has achieved a financial inclusion rate in just 6 years which would have taken 47 years to achieve. Using this model, India has transferred 360 billion dollars directly to the bank accounts of those in need over the past decade.

Most of Wall Street expects the Fed to stand pat on rates at its next meeting later this month. Also coming next week will be a decision on rates by the European Central Bank and more data about China's economy. China's recovery since removing anti-COVID restrictions has fallen well short of expectations, which has removed a big driver of growth for the global economy but also helped to remove some upward pressure on inflation. In stock markets abroad, Japan's Nikkei 225 dropped 1.2% after a report showed the world's third-largest economy grew at a 4.8% annual pace in the April-June quarter. That's weaker than an earlier estimate of 6% growth. Indexes were modestly lower across much of the rest of Asia, though higher across Europe.

AP police name ex-CM Naidu as A37 in skill development corporation scam case

Chennai, Sep 10 2023: The Crime Investigation Department which arrested TDP supremo N Chandrababu Naidu in the skill development corporation scam case has said the former Chief Minister was non-cooperative during questioning and replied vaguely saying he did not remember certain issues. Naidu was produced in an Anti-Corruption Bureau court in Vijayawada on Sunday morning amid tight security, a day after being arrested in a case of alleged corruption. Seeking his judicial custody, the remand report said though the officials arranged a chopper to take him to Vijayawada from Nandyal where he was arrested, the Leader of the Opposition refused. The convoy was obstructed several times by TDP



cadres which is an indication of intimidating law enforcement officials by virtue of his position. "He was asked questions based on the note files, which form part of the evidence in this case diary. But to all the questions he was non-cooperative and replied vaguely that he could not recollect the facts. In this regard, the report was drafted in the presence of the mediators and duly attested by him," the report said. The CID report further said after

reaching the office of the CID, Naidu was questioned about his role in the offences in the presence of mediators. He was given breaks as per his request to consult a legal counsel, to meet the members of his family and have food and refreshments.. It said the TDP chief is not a flight risk. The CID alleged that Chandrababu Naidu and the Telugu Desam Party were the "end beneficiaries" of the misappropriated funds.

The CID named G Subba Rao and K Lakshminarayana, former government employees, as A1 and A2 respectively in the case. According to the remand report submitted to the court, Naidu was named as Accused 37 (A37) in the case. Naidu was arrested in a pre-dawn operation on Saturday at Nandyal for his alleged role in a multi-crore Skill Development Corporation scam, which involved officers knocking on the door of the caravan in which he was sleeping. The former CM was arrested by the CID around 6 am on Saturday from a marriage hall (outside which his caravan was parked) at Gnanapuram in Nandyal. The CID chief N Sanjay had said Naidu was the "principal conspirator" in

Wall Street closes its worst week in the last 3 with a quiet finish

Chennai, Sep 10 2023: Stocks edged higher on Friday, but not by enough to keep Wall Street from closing out its first losing week in the last three. The S&P 500 ticked up 6.35 points, or 0.1%, to 4,457.49 after falling for three straight days. It lost 1.3% for the week, which was shortened by the Labor Day holiday. The Dow Jones Industrial Average rose 75.86, or 0.2%, to 34,576.59, and the Nasdaq composite added 12.69, or 0.1%, to 13,761.53. Those indexes also fell for the week because of worries that a too-warm economy will push the Federal Reserve to keep interest rates high for longer. Traders ratcheted back expectations for cuts to rates next year by the Fed, after reports showed the U.S. economy remains resilient despite much higher rates and struggles for other economies around the world. Such data have pushed yields higher in the bond market, which hurts stock prices. But yields held relatively steady on Friday, helping to keep Wall Street quiet. The yield on the 10-year Treasury inched up to 4.26% from 4.25% late Thursday. The two-year Treasury yield, which more closely tracks expectations for the Fed, rose to 4.97% from 4.95%. Companies are basically done with



reporting their earnings results for the spring, but a few on Friday made some of the largest moves. Smith & Wesson Brands jumped 10.8% after the gun maker reported stronger results for the three months than analysts expected. The summer is usually a lean season for the company, but its sales rose 35% from a year earlier. Kroger climbed 3.1% following its earnings report. The grocer's results for the latest quarter topped analysts' expectations, but its revenue fell short of expectations. The company announced an agreement to sell some stores, private-label brands and other assets as they try to get approval from regulators for their proposed merger. Kroger also announced an agreement where it would pay more than \$1.2 billion to settle the majority of claims related to opioids that could be brought against it by states, subdivisions and Native American tribes. The upcoming week could be a busier

one for markets globally. The centerpiece is likely the latest monthly update on inflation in the United States, due on Wednesday. Economists expect it to show prices at the consumer level were 3.6% higher in August than a year earlier. Inflation has been generally cooling since peaking above 9% last summer, but the worry is the last bit of improvement to get to the Fed's 2% target may prove the most difficult. That's why strong economic reports recently have unsettled the market. They could be providing fuel for U.S. households to keep spending, which encourages companies to try to push prices up further. High rates are supposed to slow the economy and hurt the job market, which should ultimately help undercut inflation. But the highest rates in more than two decades have yet to do that with great effect. The threat is that could push the Fed to raise rates again and at the very least to keep them high for longer than investors expect. In conversations

On Saturday, about 170 guests attended a G20 special dinner at the Bharat Mandapam, hosted by President Murmu. The menu of the official dinner featured

several millet based dishes. According to a statement given by G20 India's Special Secretary Muktesh Pardeshi to ANI, the catering at the venue, where the G20 Summit meetings are held is being done by the ITC hotel chain. Also, on Saturday, the first ladies and spouses of G20 member countries experienced the agricultural prowess of India first-hand, in a one-of-a-kind exhibition organized by the Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare at the Indian Agricultural Research Institute (IARI) Campus in Pusa in the national capital.
