COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY MINISTER SHRI PIYUSH GOYAL HOLDS BILATERAL TALKS WITH BELGIAN FOREIGN AFFAIRS AND FOREIGN TRADE MINISTER, INTERACTS WITH INDUSTRY LEADERS

Chennai, January 2025: The Commerce and Industry Minister of India, Shri Piyush Goyal, met with the Belgian Minister of Foreign Affairs, European Affairs, and Foreign Trade, Mr. Bernard Quintin, in Brussels today to discuss strengthening bilateral trade and investment ties. The meeting reinforced the longstanding

relationship between India and Belgium, built on shared values of democracy, rule of law and independent judiciary. The two leaders discussed ways to expand economic cooperation, explored new avenues to advance partnership. It may be noted that India-Belgium trade is estimated at over US\$ 15.07 billion in 2023-2024 while Foreign Direct Investments from Belgium into India was estimated at



the During discussions, both leaders acknowledged Belgium's significant reliance on foreign trade and India's dynamic, growing economy as key factors for leveraging mutual opportunities. Recognizing potential of trade as a cornerstone of their partnership, they emphasized importance of diversifying trade relations deepening economic diplomacy to achieve sustainable growth.



CM ASKS CENTRE TO WITHDRAW DRAFT UGC REGULATIONS

Chennai Jan 22, 2025 In an effort to rally opposition to two contentious draft recently regulations released by the Grants University (UGC), Commission Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M.K. Stalin on Monday penned a letter to the Chief Ministers of all opposition-ruled states, urging them to pass resolutions in their respective assemblies against the proposals.

The letter addressed to the Chief Ministers of Himachal Pradesh, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Kerala, Punjab, Telangana, West Bengal, Jammu and and Delhi. Kashmir, Referring to the resolution passed by the Tamil Nadu Assembly, which called for the immediate repeal of these guidelines, Stalin the emphasized importance of states adopting a unified stance.

Highlighting the draft regulations' problematic including aspects, limiting states' roles in appointing vice-
